I had a surprise visit from two proud boys from Penguin class this week, well done Reggie and Louie B! They proudly discussed with me the language they used in their writing work, they are determined to pop back next week to show me that they are mastering joining up their letters.

Talk Time This week I met with Sophie C, Bolu, Louie, Lilly B, Layla, Jacob and discussed Respect. The children have talked to their classes about this topic and this is what they had to say:

- 1. How does it make you feel to sit on the Golden Table.

 Sophie said I 'feel excited and really happy'. Bolu is proud and amazed when he is chosen. Lilly reported that Shri felt 'just wonderful' and Cameron reflected that he felt 'grown up'. Jacob said he was always a 'little nervous because he had to show the HEARTS values all through lunch'.
 - 2. As a class can you think of three ways you might be able to earn a special ticket to sit on the Golden Table?
 - Some of the ideas discussed are:
 - Show respect
 - Use manners by saying 'please and thank you'
 - Use a knife and fork
 - Use quiet voices in the dinner hall
 - Louie said 'remember not to touch other people's food!'

- Lilly remembered that Wren class discussed being careful and safe with cutlery, 'control your knife so you don't cut anyone' she said.
- 3. What can you do to show you are respectful to each other in the dinner hall?

Layla said 'be kind' and Jacob said 'help others to pour a drink'.

Penguin class said, remember to listen to an adult.

Bolu said Puffin class reflected that they needed to 'wait till you are called'. Sophie knew that I had reminded Puffin's to walk in quietly. Lilly agreed Mrs Boswell might get a headache and won't be able to hear other people's order. Lilly and Louie agreed that this could be difficult as then food would be wasted. Quite a conversation happened around this issue.

All of the group talked about using china plates and how to hold them carefully and balance well. 'Gravy might drip' Layla said and then there could be an accident.

Sophie suggested covering her mouth when she is eating and wanting to say something. Jacob said, 'just 'chew your food and swallow before you talk'. This sounds like a good plan!

Sophie reminded the group that you need to put your hand up before starting your desert.

Lilly ended the Talk Time by reminding everyone to thank the dinner ladies. This shows we remember our manners because if we don't show them we won't get anywhere. Her mum tells her that, mums know best (her words!).

7 questions to help you start a conversation with your child about online safety

#WakeUpWednesday



Which apps/games are you using at the moment?

THIS WILL GIVE YOU A GOOD OVERVIEW OF THE TYPES OF THINGS YOUR CHILDREN ARE DOING ON THEIR DEVICES, ALONG WITH THEIR INTERESTS. REMEMBER THAT THEY MIGHT NOT TELL YOU EVERYTHING THEY ARE USING, SO IT IS A GOOD IDEA TO ASH THEM TO SHOW YOU THEIR DEVICE. BECAUSE NEW APPS AND GAMES ARE RELEASED REGULARLY, IT IS IMPORTANT TO HAVE THIS CONVERSATION OFTEN TO ENSURE YOU ARE UP TO DATE WITH WHAT THEY ARE DOING.



AS IN THE TIP ABOVE, ASKING THIS QUESTION WILL ALLOW YOU TO FIND OUT WHAT YOUR CHILD IS DOING ONLINE, AND ENCOURAGE POSITIVE CONVERSATIONS ABOUT THEIR ONLINE ACTIVITY. ASK THEM HOW THEY USE THE WEBSITES, AND TAKE AN INTEREST IN HOW THEY CAN USE THEM IN A POSITIVE WAY, ALSO ASKING THEM TO SHOW YOU IF POSSIBLE.


SHOW A GENUINE INTEREST IN WHAT THEY ARE DOING. WHILST YOU ARE PLAYING A GAME OR USING AN APP WITH THEM, IT MIGHT HIGHLIGHT SOMETHING THAT THEY DON'T NECESSARILY THINH IS A DANGER TO THEM. IF THEY ACT LIKE THEY DON'T WANT TO SHARE THEIR ACTIVITIES WITH YOU, QUESTION WHY.

Do you have any online friends?


CHILDREN CAN FORM POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS WITH PEOPLE ONLINE, AND THIS HAS BECOME MORE COMMON THANKS TO ONLINE MULTI-PLAYER OPTIONS, BUT THEY MAY NOT FULLY UNDERSTAND THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A FRIEND AND A STRANGER. YOU COULD MAKE THE QUESTION MORE SPECIFIC TO YOUR CHILD, FOR EXAMPLE: "HAVE YOU MET ANYONE ONLINE THAT YOU LIKE TO PLAY GAMES WITH?" THEY MAY NOT WANT TO SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH YOU, SO ENSURE YOU TEACH THEM ABOUT HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS.







ALTHOUGH YOU MAY BE THE ADULT THEY TRUST THE MOST, SOME CHILDREN STRUGGLE TO TALK ABOUT WHAT HAPPENS ONLINE DUE TO CONFUSION OR EMBARRASSMENT. BECAUSE OF THIS THEY MAY STRUGGLE TO APPROACH THE NORMAL PEOPLE WHO WOULD HELP, SUCH AS YOURSELF OR A TEACHER. HAVE A CHAT TO YOUR CHILD ABOUT EXACTLY WHERE THEY CAN GO FOR HELP, AND HOW THEY CAN REPORT ANY ACTIVITY THAT THEY BELIEVE IS INAPPROPRIATE ONLINE.



YOUR CHILD MAY ALREADY HNOW WHAT THEIR PERSONAL INFORMATION IS BUT THEY MIGHT NOT THINK ABOUT HOW IT CAN BE SHARED. HAVE A CONVERSATION ABOUT WHAT PERSONAL INFORMATION IS AND HOW THIS CAN AFFECT THEM IF IT IS SHARED BEYOND THE INTENDED RECIPIENT. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOUR CHILD UNDERSTANDS THE DANGERS OF SHARING CONTACT DETAILS OR PHOTOS, AS INFORMATION SUCH AS THIS CAN SPREAD QUICKLY ONLINE.



Do you know your limits?



CHILDREN MAY NOT UNDERSTAND THE NEGATIVE IMPACTS OF DEVICE OR GAME ADDICTION. TALK
TO THEM OPENLY ABOUT HEALTHY HABITS AND ASH WHETHER OR NOT THEM SPENDING TIME
ONLINE OR PLAYING A GAME IS AFFECTING THEIR SLEEP, PERFORMANCE AT SCHOOL OR IF THEY
ARE GENERALLY LOSING INTEREST IN OTHER ACTIVITIES. YOU MAY LEAD ON TO ENCOURAGING
ALTERNATIVE ACTIVITIES AND DISCUSSING THE INTRODUCTION OF TIME LIMITS WHEN AT HOME.

2:50pm Families welcome to enjoy the still surroundings and participate in the time we have enjoyed in the hall.


Wednesday 3rd April - Easter crafts and activities. Special members of our family are invited into school for Easter fun. Details to follow.
